

Mass Prophylaxis Preparedness & Planning MGT-319

This course addresses local public health and medical preparedness with other community partners in preparation for the coordination of plans to provide mass distribution of medical countermeasures for the jurisdiction as it relates to the Division of Strategic National Stockpile (DSNS) Program. This course addresses Emergency Support Function #8 issues.

Participants completing this course will gain an enhanced understanding and insight into the skills required to enhance a jurisdiction's preparedness and emergency response efforts by developing (or revising) a plan addressing an all-hazards approach towards Mass Prophylaxis. This course is a combination of lectures, small group activities and a tabletop exercise.

Workshop Topics:

The first day of training focuses on planning considerations and recommendations to achieve CDC's 48 hours or less (standalone capability) for Mass Prophylaxis. The second day of training focuses on the local community's Mass Prophylaxis plan and POD site preparedness. The course material is applicable to pandemic influenza, bio-terrorism, and other public health emergencies using at least one local POD site plan as the foundation for an exercise.

Prerequisites: None, although familiarity with the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) via completion of FEMA independent study courses IS-100, IS-200, IS-700, and IS-800 (or their equivalents) is recommended.
