## Description



The goal of this course is to inform, enable, and encourage state, local, tribal, territorial, and private Critical Infrastructure and Key Resources (CIKR) partners to leverage the resources that enhance CIKR protection efforts. It also provides public and private sector partners within the Nation's CIKR with essential knowledge and awareness necessary to understand and follow the guiding principles, roles, and responsibilities that underlie the Nation's collaborative strategy for CIKR protection. Participants will learn the competencies needed to perform their roles and fulfill their responsibilities necessary to achieve CIKR protection goals and implement Sector-Specific Plans (SSPs) set forth in the National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP).

In this course participants will enhance their skills to formulate considerations for the resiliency of jurisdictional assets leveraging cross-sector partnerships. These considerations will enhance the whole community's ability to manage the risk associated with critical infrastructure protection efforts. The course will implement the National Preparedness Goal by facilitating the development of Resiliency Action Plans, involving all jurisdictional critical infrastructure partners. Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to increase infrastructure owner/operator participation in jurisdictional planning, organizing, equipping, training, and exercising critical infrastructure protection efforts.

- Describe the national strategy of resilience relative to the local partner role
- Describe the whole community approach relative to the National Preparedness Goal
- Identify and prioritize jurisdictional critical infrastructure assets and interdependencies across all Critical Infrastructure sectors
  - Describe the purpose and components of a resilience plan
  - Analyze asset and sector impact on jurisdictional resilience
- Develop options for sector-specific next steps for highest-priority sectors
  - Develop a list of jurisdiction-level (regional) resilience actions
